1ST NOVEMBER – ALL SAINTS

The veneration of Saints started in the middle of the 2nd century. Martyrs were the first to be so honored and later the Apostles were also included in the liturgical observances of the church. Special veneration was also extended to those who were tortured, suffered imprisonment or exile for the sake of their faith. Later outstanding Christians were recognized by the Church who showed extraordinary Christian discipleship and whose lives were viewed as a kind of unbloody martyrdom.

The origins of the feast of All Saints started in the East, where as early as the 4th century there was a memorial for all the martyrs; this was celebrated in different places and dates. In Rome it was celebrated on 13th May, in England and Ireland in the 8th century on 1st of November. In the 9th century this date was accepted everywhere.

GIFT AID

We will shortly be submitting a Gift Aid claim for the last tax year. If your circumstances changed during that period and you did not pay tax please let us know so that we can update our records. Unless you advise us otherwise, we will assume that all details previously submitted are correct and claim accordingly on all envelopes and standing orders.

As we are now able to claim Gift Aid on all cash given in the collection, (though not £50 notes or cheques), we will no longer use planned giving envelopes which were an earlier form of doing this. Fewer people now use these & the envelopes were time consuming to count and cost £300 each year.

If you are giving by standing order and are a tax payer, please fill in a Gift Aid form so that the parish can claim the tax you have paid to the government. This costs you nothing, but help us enormously. If you are not sure whether you have done this please help us by doing it now. Without Gift Aid we will not be able to balance the books this year. Many thanks.
