COVID PRECAUTIONS - READ CAREFULLY

As more people return to Mass we need to review & restate the position for those coming to St. Luke's: Some restrictions remain, either by law, or by way of the risk assessment of our building. It is not a free-for-all - please follow instructions & be sensitive and considerate towards each other.

1. No one has the right to do whatever they want!
2. Please continue to sanitise your hands on entry and exit. Wear a face covering.
3. If medically exempt from wearing a face mask this should be based on the advice of your doctor rather than personal opinion - please wear an exemption lanyard/badge.
4. In law those not wearing a face mask may not sing, unless choir members.
5. The sign of peace remains suspended in any form. Holy Water may not be used.
6. At Holy Communion come forward row by row maintaining 1m distancing and (apart from the front row) return to places through the rooms at the sides of the building.
7. We leave the church via the rear door, again maintaining 1m distance.
8. Cambridgeshire Health Service have asked us to stress caution - cases are rising again and in our area of the city are amongst the worst in the country.
9. Flu is now also posing a threat – please get vaccinated for this and for Covid if you not already done so.
10. Further restrictions or relaxations may be announced without warning as needed.

Please remember that the parish priest is personally liable in civil and church law for the health & safety of everyone in the building, along with safeguarding.

ALL SAINTS – SOLEMNITY

First Reading – Apocalypse 7:2-4, 9-14

The Book of Revelation, from which this reading is taken, was written during the first persecutions of the Christians. It is built on the promise that, after persecution, those who are faithful to God and to Christ will be delivered and gathered into the peace of God's presence. At the time of writing, the persecuting force from which they were to be delivered was the might of the Roman Empire, with its immorality, its materialism, its consumerism, and above all its demand that all its subjects should worship the Emperor as Lord. For Christians at that time, the late first century, the great test was whether they would accept the standards of the Empire or remain faithful to the demanding standards of Christianity. The same decision stands before Christians in today's world. Who is my Lord, Christ or the standards for which the Emperor stood, carelessness about sexual morality, materialism, consumerism, putting myself first in everything without regard for the cost to others? Do I connive at and approve standards of behaviour which are built on a morality far from that of Christ? More pressingly, do I accept those standards for myself?

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The average weekly cost of maintaining the parish is £1,827.00, which includes loan repayments of £350 due to end at the middle of next year and the 37% of the offertory which goes to support the Diocese of East Anglia.

17/10 Cash Collections £626, Standing Orders £833, Contactless/Online £155. Total £1,614.

£320 was raised for Cafod on harvest family fast day.

With other income such as mass stipends, funeral fees, fundraising events, one off donations etc., we are breaking even on average. This is quite an achievement in the current climate, so thank you all for your generosity and support of our parish community!
